
Our learning this half term

In English we will start the half term with the well-known poem of 'The Owl and the Pussy-cat' by Edward Lear, where we will be writing letters as well as looking at the use of rhyme in the poems. We will also read 'The Further Adventures of the Owl and the Pussy-cat' by Julia Donaldson as a sequel. Towards the end of the half term we will study the text 'The Odd Egg' where we will write our own egg-spotters non-fiction guides.

In **science** we will be looking at the animal groups of mammals, amphibians, reptiles, fish and birds, as well as looking at which animals are herbivores, carnivores or omnivores. We will then learn about basic needs of survival and how animals have offspring which turn into adults.

In our **geography** lessons we will look at the continents of the world and the oceans. We will then be comparing the UK to a non-European country and looking at geographical differences and similarities.

In our **R.E.** lessons we will be learning about the Easter story with a focus on the resurrection. Our big enquiry this half term is: 'How important is it for Christians that Jesus came back to life after the crucifixion?'



Maths

In maths this half term we will be learning to:

- Compare amounts of money
- Calculate change
- Measure with cm
- Measure and interpret scales for mass, volume and temperature


